*The World Sustainable Development Summit (WSDS) is the annual flagship multi-stakeholder event organized by The Energy and Resources Institute (TERI). As the only independently convened international summit on sustainable development and the environment based in the Global South, WSDS provides a unique platform for global leaders and thinkers to come together and address pressing global challenges. The summit aims to deliver long-term solutions for the benefit of global communities, with the Act4Earth initiative playing a pivotal role in extending its reach. Act4Earth fosters closer engagement with stakeholders and promotes collective action through policy research and dialogue, enhancing the summit's impact. WSDS plays a critical role in fostering research and dialogue that reinforce and strengthen commitments at all levels. This approach aims to enhance ambition and drive meaningful action, creating a pathway toward a more sustainable and equitable world for both present and future generations.*

*The urgency for transformative action cannot be overstated. The first global stock-take has revealed alarming data: achieving the ambitious temperature goals will require a 43% reduction in global emissions by 2030. However, the current nationally determined contributions are projected to lead to only a 2% reduction. Similarly, the mid-point review of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) highlights significant challenges. Out of 169 targets, only 13% are on track, while 18% are not even being monitored. These findings reveal critical gaps, not only in implementation but also in the availability of data to measure progress effectively.*

*The challenges confronting the world are complex and interconnected, necessitating collective action on an unprecedented scale. Partnerships hold the key to addressing these issues by accelerating problem-solving and fostering implementation. By sharing responsibilities and enabling collaboration, partnerships bring together resources, expertise, and innovative ideas to drive sustainable solutions. Recognizing this, the theme of the World Sustainable Development Summit 2025 is: **Partnerships for Accelerating Sustainable Development and Climate Solutions**. This theme underscores the importance of cooperation in tackling the multifaceted challenges of our time. By uniting global leaders and stakeholders, the summit seeks to drive enhanced commitments, informed policies, and collaborative frameworks for a more sustainable and equitable future.*
